Panchama Pada: Tracing the Dalit Movement in Karnataka through the Written Word and Song (A Work in Progress Performance) by the Jangama Collective

Panchama was a magazine closely aligned with the Dalit Movement in Karnataka that gave voice to a generation of writers and journalists to document their contemporary moment including atrocities against Dalits.
